

Education K-12 and Secondary Prerequisite and Core Professional Requirements Advising Worksheet – See also Course Catalog

For formal acceptance into the Rocky Mountain College teacher education program, you must complete, or be in the current process of completing, with a grade of C- or better, the prerequisite courses listed in the first section below. After that coursework has been completed, you must (1) fill out the teacher education program admission form found in the teacher education handbook (on the College's website), (2) conduct a successful interview with members of the teacher education committee, and (3) pass a supervised writing test. You must also take and pass the appropriate portions of the Praxis II exam (consult your advisor for the required portions) directly before or directly following your student teaching semester.
