





# 2. If you are a student, what year are you? 39 responses




### 3. How did you hear about the survey?


## 4. How often do you use the library?


#### 5. What do you use the library for (please check all that apply)?






## 9. Do you prefer to use print books or ebooks?




## 10. Please rate how satisfied you are with the library's e-book collection:



Would like Jstor


Everyone says they want JSTOR (way too expensive) but the databases we have cover much of what we need and ILL is super efficient

Was a big help when working on one of my papers for PoliSci


