



2026-2027 Verification Worksheet for Dependent Students

Your 2026–2027 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. In this process, RMC will be comparing your FAFSA information with the information on this worksheet and any other required documents. If there are differences between your FAFSA information and your financial documents, RMC will make the corrections and notify you in writing. The law requires the college to review this information before awarding Federal aid (34 CFR, Part 668). Complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and submit this form to the RMC Financial Aid office **as soon as possible** so your financial aid won't be delayed. **Verification must be completed no later than 14 days prior to the end of the first semester of enrollment.** Failure to complete verification will result in the cancellation of all federal and institutional need-based aid. No federal loans or grants or institutional need-based aid will be disbursed until verification is complete.

B. Family Size

- Your parents, even if you don't live with your parents. Exclude a parent who has died or is not living in the household because of separation or divorce. Include a parent who is on active duty in the US Armed Forces apart from the family
- Your siblings if **all** of the following are true: a) they live with your parents (or live apart because of college enrollment), b) they receive more than half of their support from your parents, and c) will continue to receive more than half of their support from your parents from July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2027.
- Other people if **all** of the following is true: a) they now live with your parents, b) they receive more than half of their support from your parents, and c) they will continue to receive more than half of their support from July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027.

The provided criteria for "dependent children" or "other persons" mirror the requirement that family size align with those the parent could claim as a dependent on a U.S. tax return if the parent were to file a US tax return at the time of completing the 2026-2027 FAFSA. As a result, the parent should not include any unborn children in the family size.
